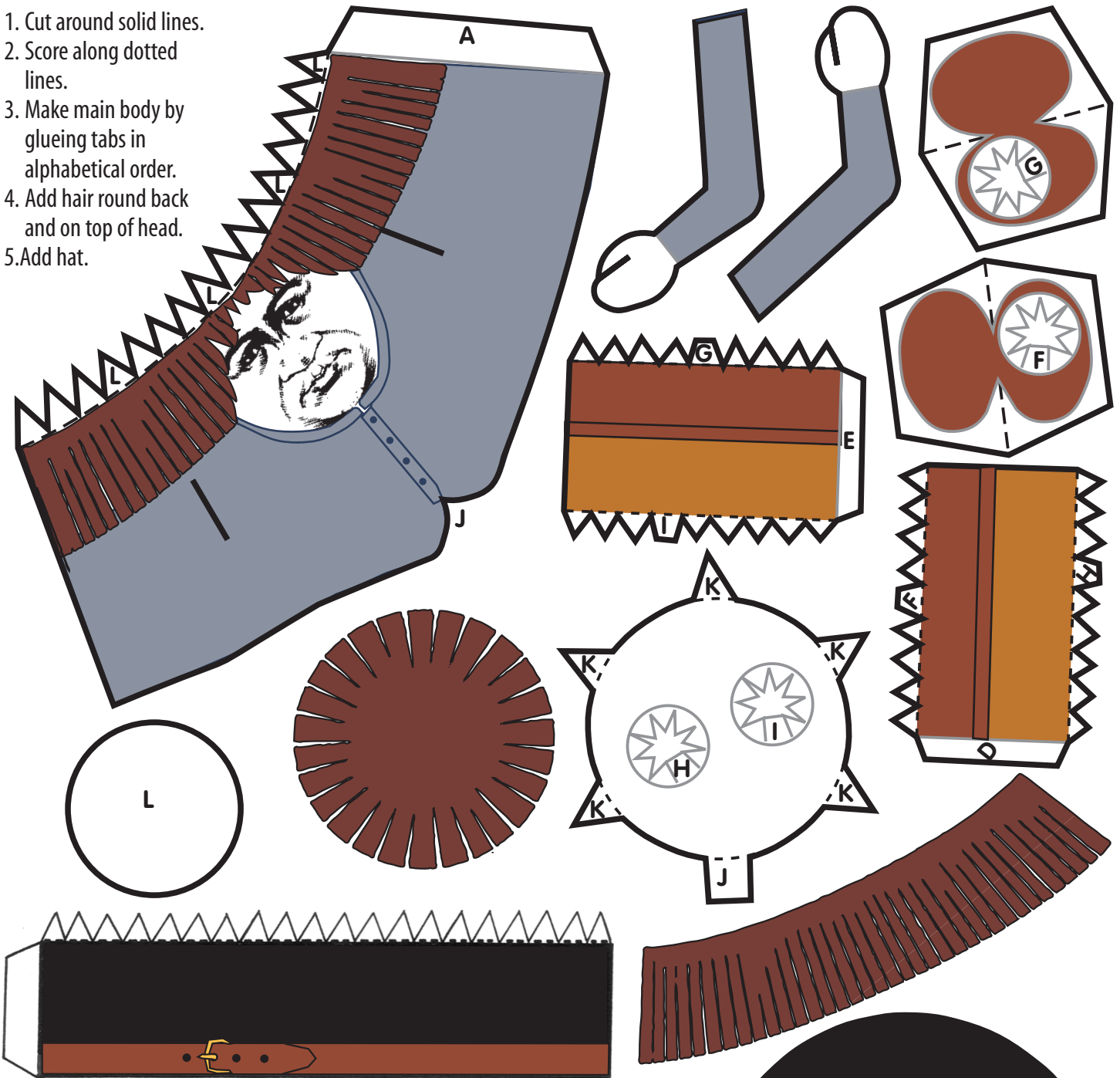
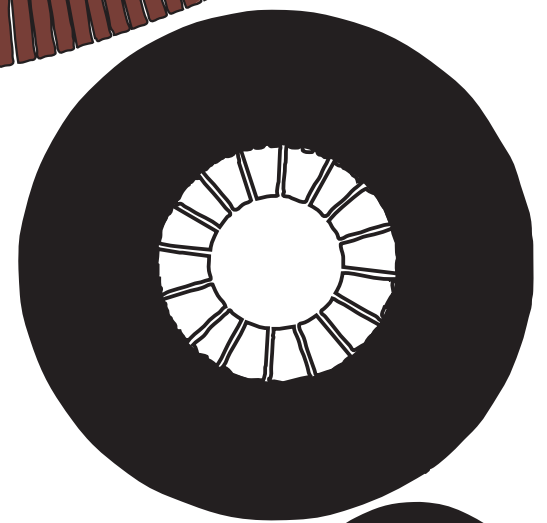


1. Cut around solid lines.

**George Fox  
(1624–1691)**

George Fox was born in Fenny Drayton in Leicestershire. In his teens he was upset by people who went to church but were still drunk and dishonest. He travelled north and in 1652, at the top of Pendle Hill in Lancashire, he had a vision to gather good people together. He said that goodness wasn't in churches but in ordinary men and women who listened to God inside them. His followers, called 'Friends' or 'Quakers', worship in silence. They wait for God to speak through any one of them: young or old, rich or poor, man, woman or child. George Fox was working with Quakers in London when he died. He was buried at Bunhill Fields. Quakers don't have priests because there is 'that of God' in everyone. They believe that making a good world for us all needs action. They work for peace and fairness.
